Aya: No, it's not mine.

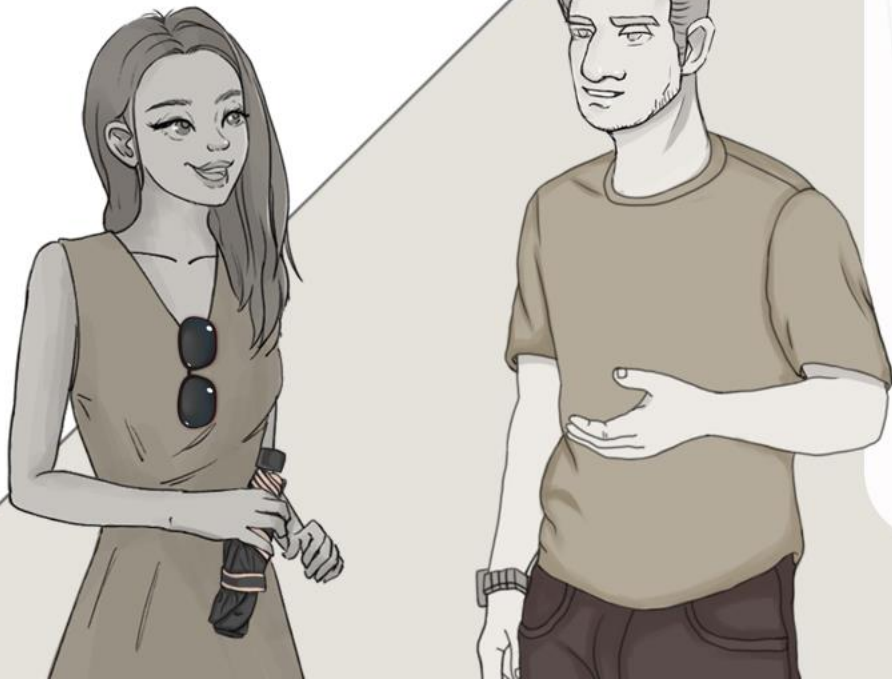
Dad: **Whose sun umbrella is it?**

Dad: Esta's umbrella looks pretty good.

Aya: Yes. I just saw a new pair of boots at the door.  
Whose boots are those?

Dad: Oh, those are your uncle's boots. He'll join us for dinner.

## Possessive Pronouns

.....  
something belonging to someone

Possessive Adjectives	my	your	his	her	its	their
Possessive Pronouns	mine	yours	his	hers	/	theirs

This is my book. → This (book) is **mine**. Those are his pens. → Those pens are **his**.  
Is this your bike? → Is this (bike) **yours**? These are their classrooms. → These classrooms are **theirs**.

**Note:** A **possessive pronoun** sometimes replaces a **possessive adjective + noun** to avoid repetition.

e.g. His book is on the table. My book is under the chair. Her book is on the bookshelf. (repetition)  
→ His book is on the table. **Mine** is under the chair. **Hers** is on the bookshelf. (repetition avoided)

## Possessive Nouns

.....  
indicate ownership (or possession) by ending with 's or '

Case	Singular Noun	Plural Nouns <b>NOT</b> Ending in S	Plural Nouns Ending in S
Form	's	's	'
e.g.	Ana's book boss's office	Children's toys people's feelings	parents' habits boys' room
