



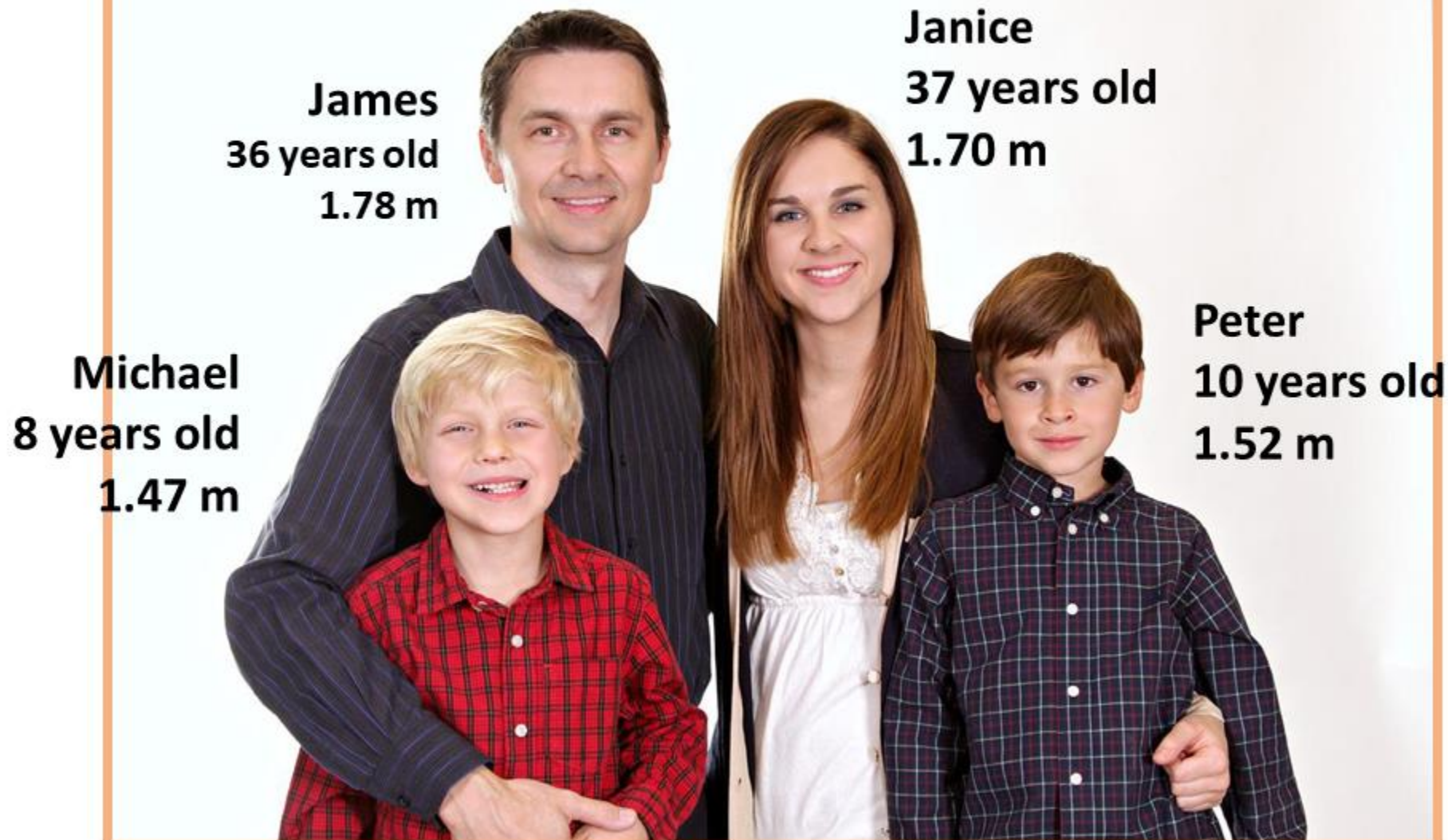

Aya: Who is the taller one standing there?

Bo: That's Rio. **He is the tallest in the campus.**

Aya: Oh, I've heard about him from others. He's the most popular student because he participates in almost every event. **He is the most talented student I've ever known.**

Bo: You know him a lot.

Aya: But I didn't have the chance to watch his performance.

Bo: Do you know that he will breakdance in the festival?

Aya: Really? That's great!

Superlatives

.....

1. Marcus is the **tallest** boy in the class.
2. This is my **thickest** book.
3. Joseph seems to be the **most excited** child at the party.
4. Today is Tracy's **best** birthday she has ever had!
5. Lauren will be the **fastest** runner in the race.
6. Science is the **most boring** class that I take at school.
7. This is the **worst** day of my life!

Note: There must be a definite article “the” or a possessive adjective before a superlative.



Learn the grammar structures.

Rules for Superlatives

- Add **-est** to one syllable words.
fast – faster – fastest
cool – cooler – coolest
- Add **-st** if it ends in -e.
safe – safer – safest
nice – nicer – nicest
- Double the consonant if it ends in CVC, and then add **-est**.
big – bigger – biggest
thin – thinner – thinnest
- If it ends in -y, change -y to **-i** and add **-est**.
happy – happier – happiest
dry – drier – driest
- For most two-syllable words and for all three or more syllables, we use **most**.
interesting
more interesting
the most interesting

Irregular Superlatives

good – better – **best**

bad – worse – **worst**

much/ many – more – **most**

little – less – **least**

no comparative or superlative form
but always in the superlative degree
