ADVERBS OF MANNER

Verbs

Adverbs describe the way an action is happening.

Adjectives

Adverbs add a degree of intensity to the adjective.

Other adverbs

Adverbs make sentences clumsy, so use them sparingly.

Sentences

Adverbs express a general opinion about the information in the sentence.

Rules when forming adverbs of manner from adjectives

- 1 For most adjectives, we simply add -ly.
 - e.g. accurate accurately
- 2 Ending in –y, changed into i then add -ly e.g. easy easily
- 3 Irregular adverbs retain as adjectives.
 - e.g. fast fast



Else & Also

We use "else" to mean another or extra in questions while we use "also" to mean in addition in answers.

- Wh-question + else + can + subject ...?
- What can you play?
 - I can play basketball.
- What else can you play?

 I can also play baseball.
