

Simple Past

is used to describe a completed action

- I/You/We/They competed against many applicants.

 He/She competed against many applicants.
- I/You/We/They didn't compete against many applicants.

 He/She didn't compete against many applicants.
- Did I/You/We/They compete against many applicants?
 Did he/she compete against many applicants?

Past Progressive

- is used to describe an action that was in progress at a specific time in the past.
- I/He/She was competing against many applicants.
 You/They/We were competing against many applicants.
- I/He/She was not competing against many applicants.
 You/They/We were not competing against many applicants.
- Was I/he/she competing against many applicants?
 Were you/they/we competing against many applicants?

Past Progressive


Simple Past

- Use the Past Progressive with Simple Past to describe
- an action that was interrupted by another action.



She was eating her breakfast when the thief stole the briefcase.





They were traveling to Brazil when you phoned them.

He was waiting for a job offer when Aya got her graphic designing job.
