Invitations – Modal: Would

Giving an Invitation

- Would you like to grab some drinks?
- Would you like me to help you?
- Would you like some coffee?

Accept an Invitation

- That would be nice
- Sure, that would be great!
- Yes, we would like to.

Reject an Invitation

- I would like to but...
- Unfortunately, I wouldn't be able to come.

"Would" can also be used to propose a change of plan/preference:

- Would it be okay to come on Saturday instead?
- Would you be fine at the weekend instead?
- I **would** prefer pasta over rice, if that's okay with you.








Directions: Prepositions of Place and Movement


- over, along, by, past, up, around



The ball is over the box.



She kicked the ball past the box.



The ball is rolling along the boxes.



He throws the ball up the stairs.



I love travelling by the sea.



The ball spins around the box.




