Countable

A large number of **people** are watching.

There are **several buildings** in my city.

Dozens of rooms have been repainted.

Most books were bought from the shop.

I can eat only a **small quantity of candies**.

Uncountable

I have a **large amount of work** to do today.

My aunt has a **great deal of money** in the bank.

He knows a **bit of information** about the project.

Most furniture in the office is brand new.

A large quantity of **water** is needed for the trees to grow fast.

Collective Nouns

a type of noun that expresses a name of a collection of a bunch of several people, objects, things, animals, etc.

Structure Rules:

- Use a **singular verb** with a collective noun acting as a **single unit**.
- Use a **plural verb** when the individual members of the group are **acting individually**.

Examples:

The **class** **listens** to their teacher carefully.

The **class** **answer** their assignments on their own.

The **committee** **is** having a meeting right now.

The **committee** **are** allowed to leave the meeting soon.
