



Past Perfect Tense

an action that started at some point in the past and ended at another point in the past.

had + verb (past participle)

The past perfect talks about or suggests a sequence of events.

Simple Past Tense: I was busy last week.

Past Perfect Tense: I had been busy last week

(until I finished negotiations with

my clients.)

Simple Past Tense: Someone took my pen.

Past Perfect Tense: Someone had taken my pen

(when I went to the toilet room.)

Past Perfect Tense uses:

Prepositions

- for
- after
- until

Conjunctions

- and
- when

Note:

But the use of prepositions and conjunctions is <u>not</u> <u>always necessary</u>.



Learn the uses of the Past Perfect Tense.

Usage 1

- for a completed action before another action
- past now future

I had given him the keys before I left the house.

My sister had taken her medicine after she ate.

Stanley had finished his homework when his favorite show started.

Usage 2

To show the duration of a completed action



He had waited for 3 hours in the café.

She hadn't seen him for 5 days until he came home.

I had not eaten a normal meal since then.
