

Future Perfect Tense

Used to express something that will be finished before a particular time in the future.

- will have + past participle
 He will have done the report by this evening.
- will + subject + have+ past participle
 Will he have done the report by this evening?
- ? will not + have + past participle
 He won't have done the report by this evening.

Other examples:

We will have moved to our new home by next week.

She won't have finished the task by next month.

Will she have worked at this company by 2026?

by + time

- by + time
 - something happened before a specific time in the future.

By next week, we will have set some new strategies.




Future Perfect Tense

Usage 1

To express an action, which will have been finished before a particular time in the future.

Examples:




By 4'oclock, I will have finished my work.

She will have **gone** to the market by 7 o'clock.

Usage 2

To express an action, which will be finished before another action in the future.

Examples:



She will have **cooked** dinner by the time we **arrive**.

I will have **finished** eating dinner by the time she **calls**.

Usage 3

To express an action, which began before and will continue up until another action in the future.

Examples:



By next week, we will have been married for 20 years.

By tomorrow, I will have worked in this company for 5 years.
