Bo: I'm hoping for the best!

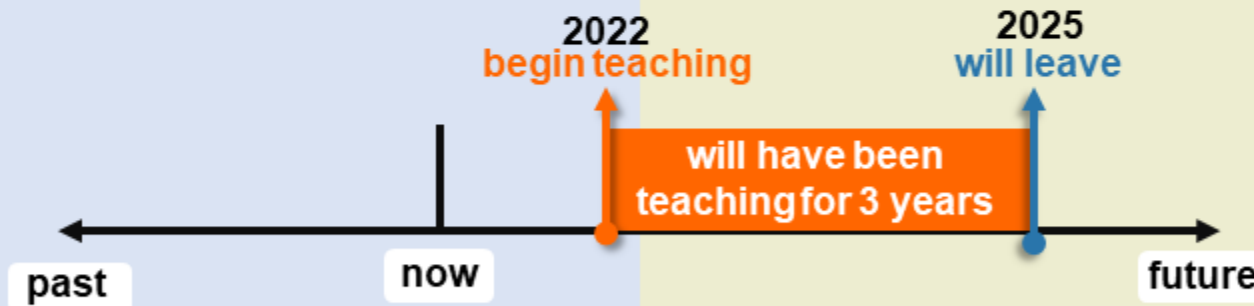

Future Perfect Progressive

Used to talk about an action that will continue at a certain time in the future.

He **will have been teaching** at university for three years by the time he leaves our town.



other examples:

They **will have been waiting** for me for a long time by the time my plane lands.

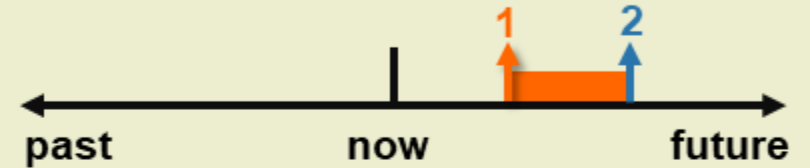
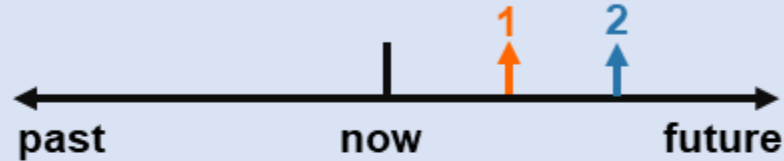
They **will have been working** on the website for two weeks when we have our next big meeting with some partners.

Form

Action 1: will + have + past participle
Action 2: simple present

Action 1: will + have + been + ing verb
Action 2: simple present

Usage

The first future action **will finish** before the second future action.

To describe an action that **will continue** until a particular event or time in the future.

Time Markers

by the time, until + time

by the time, when

Example

She **will have completed** the project by the time I **call** her.

She **will have been sleeping** for seven hours by the time her alarm clock **goes off**.
