Concern

Something that worries you or something that is important.

■ Expressing Concern

- ✓ **Be** specific.
- ✓ **Be** objective and lose any emotional attachment.
- ✓ **Come** with solutions in mind.
- ✓ **Get** support if necessary.
- ✓ **Leave** the decision up to the boss.

Sample Phrases

- *I don't think you've considered ...*
- *I have some concerns regarding ...*
- *What information do you have about ...?*
- *We do have some doubts that ...*
- *I can see your concerns for ... but I am slightly concerned about ...*

Collocations:

The combination of words that are often used together.

concern (that)

I'm *concerned that* the management will lay off employees.

a matter of concern

This is *a matter of concern* for all of us.

main/primary/major concern

The *major concern* is looking for a new location.

cause concern/be a cause of concern

The new mall could *be a cause of concern* for small businesses.

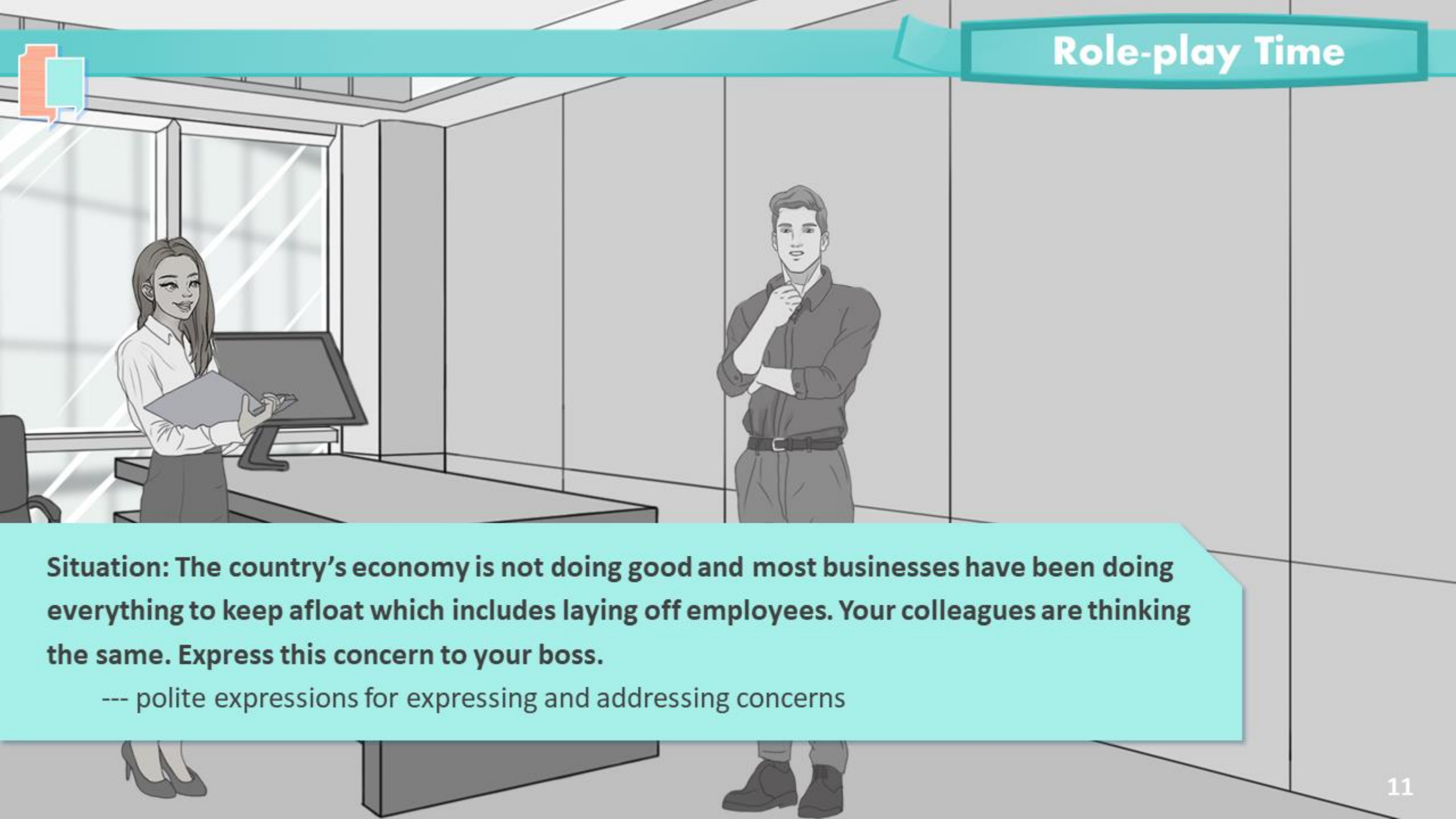
