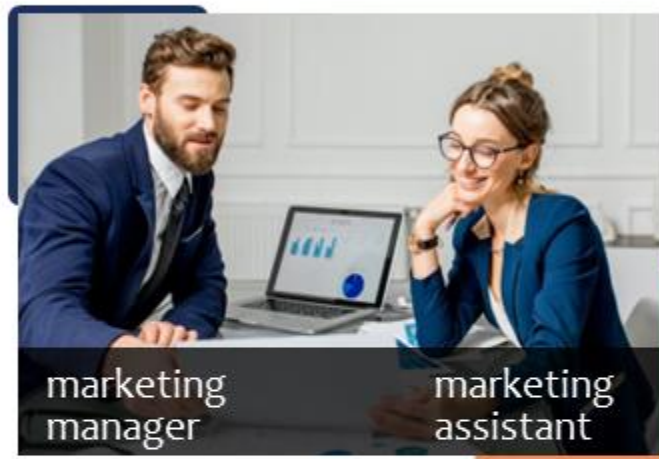

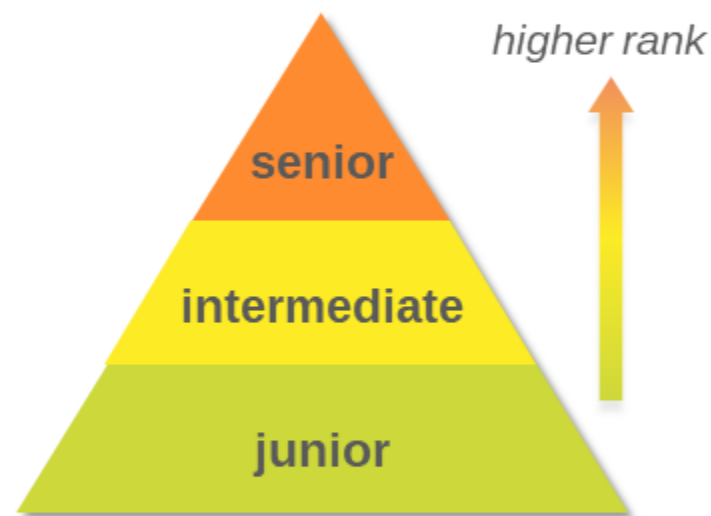

∴ Talking About Past Work Experience

- **I was at the** *(position)* **of** *(company/ department/ office)*.
- **I worked as a** *(position)*.

Example sentences:

- I was a trainer in my last department.
- I worked as a marketing assistant in my previous company.
- I worked as a part-time teacher.

You can also use:

- **used to be ...**

e.g. I used to be a dentist.

- **held the position of ...**

e.g. I held the position of manager in my last job.

Learn who to introduce first depending on rank.

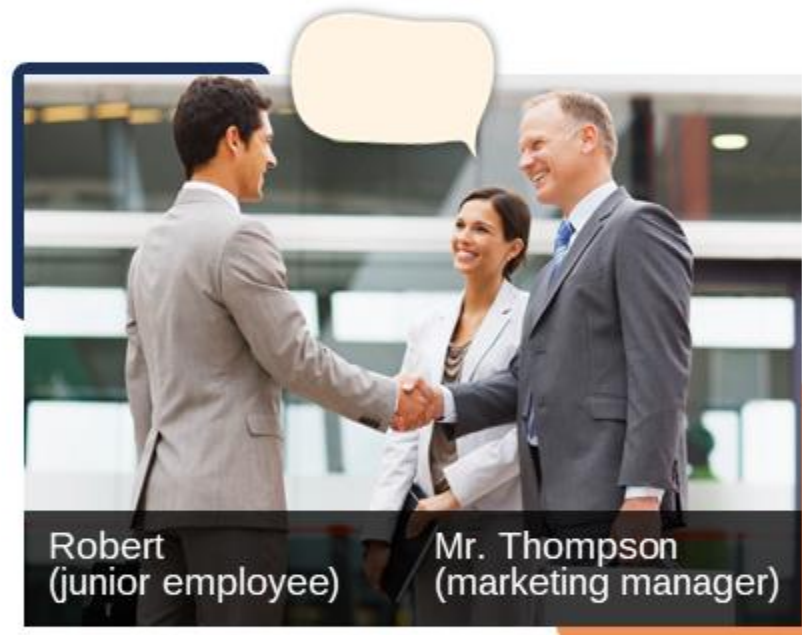
⋮ How to Introduce Two People at Work

1. Introduce the junior person to the senior.
2. Introduce the senior person to the junior.

Example:

“Mr. Thompson, may I introduce Robert? Robert is our new editor.

Robert, this is Mr. Thompson. He is our marketing manager.”
