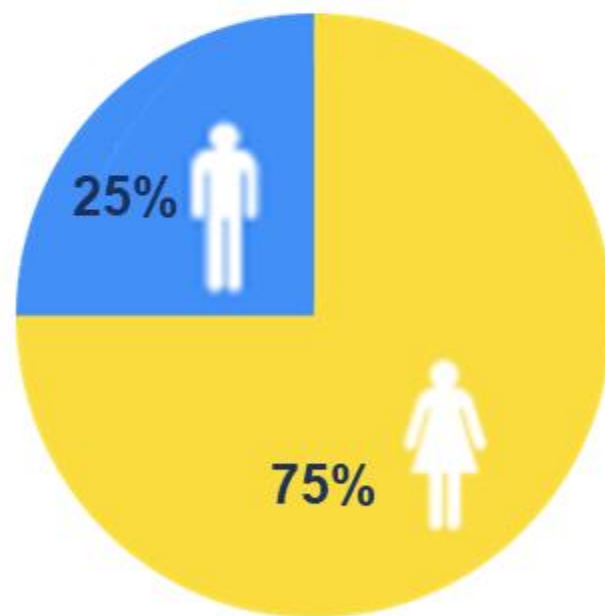
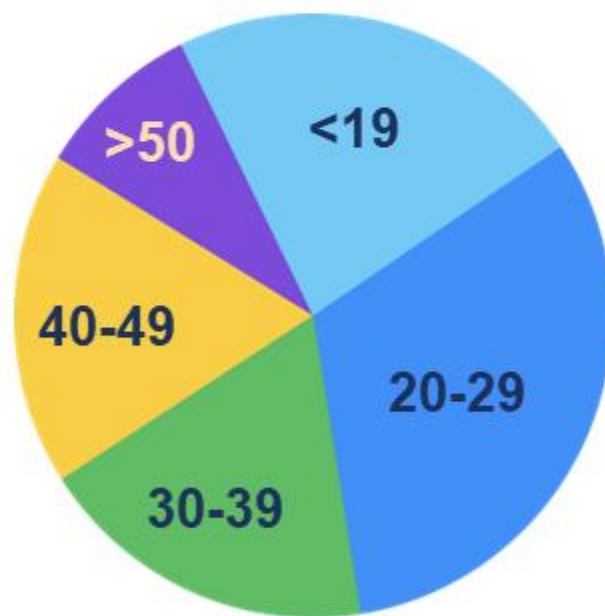




Chart 1 breaks down the users by age.

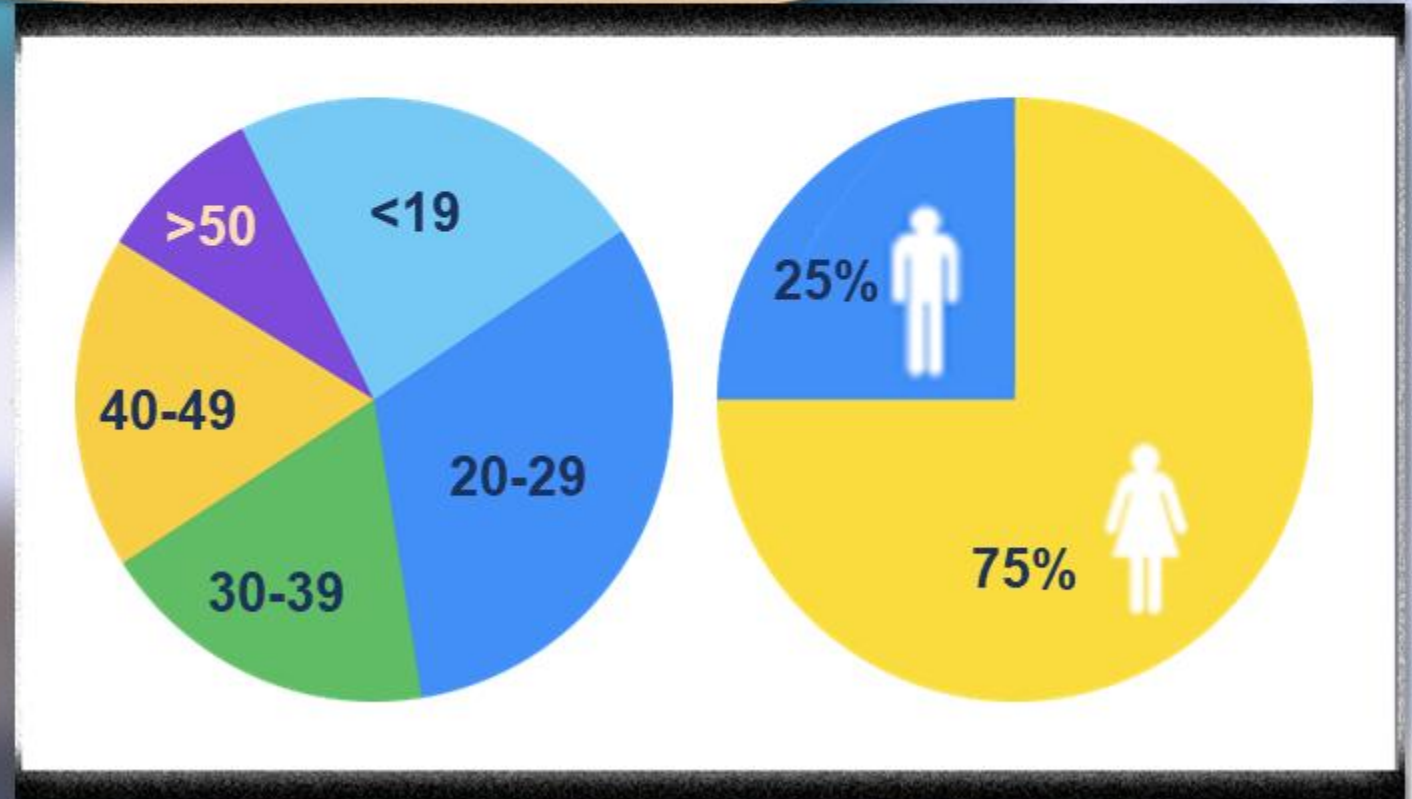
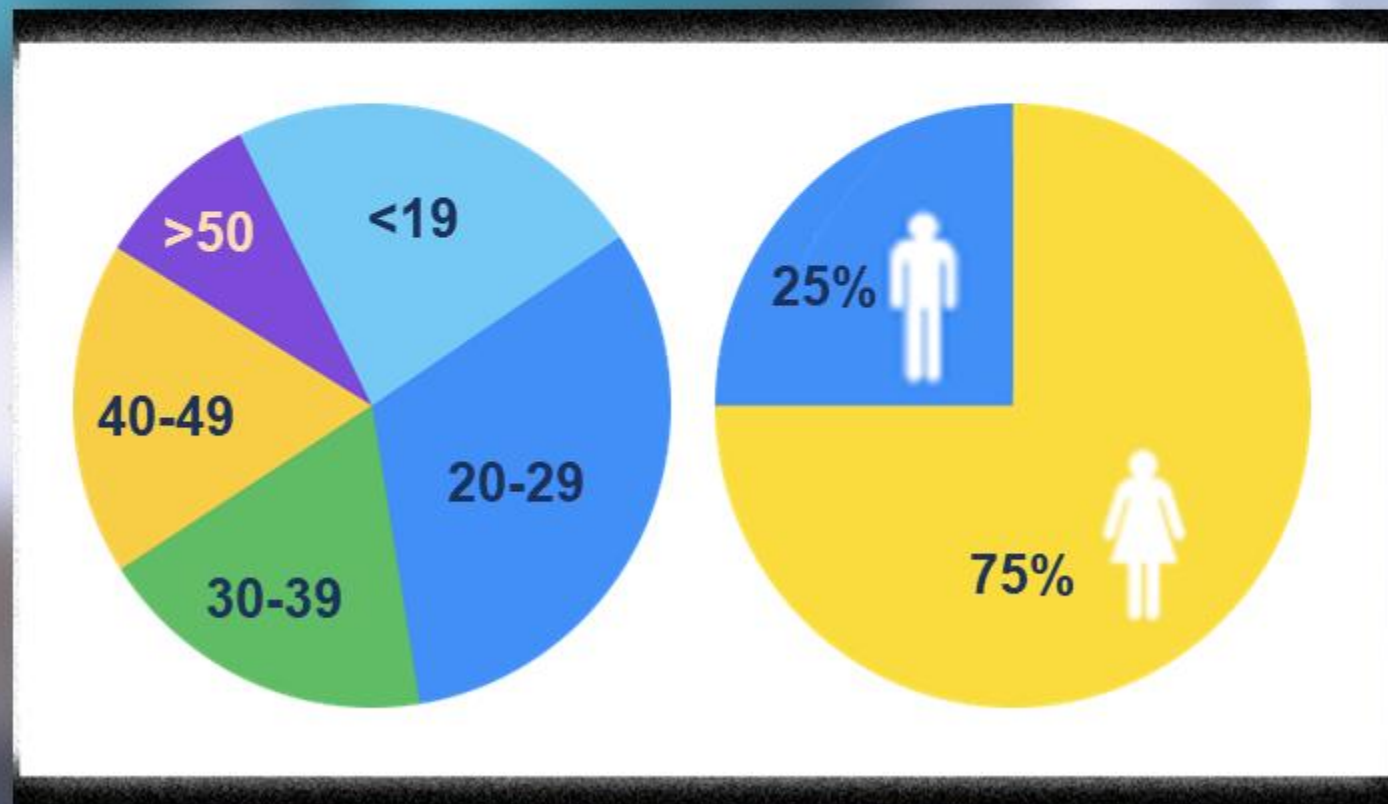

*(phr.v.) to separate something into smaller parts*

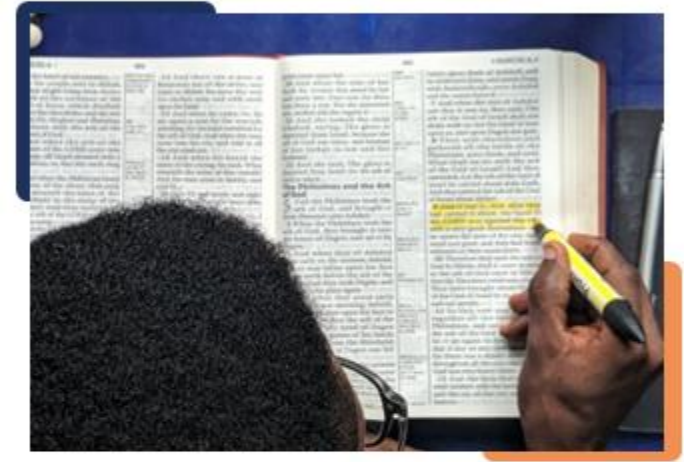
e.g. The report **breaks down** the results region by region.

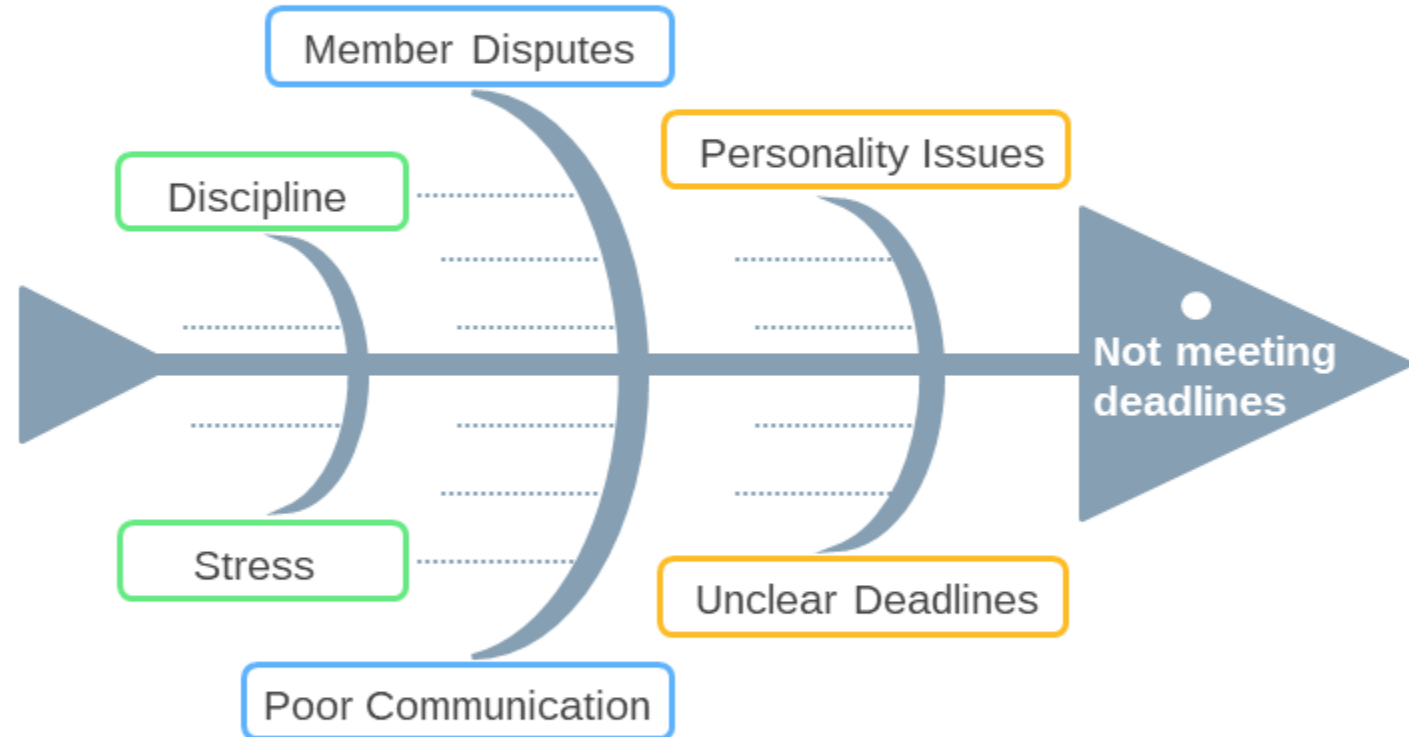
