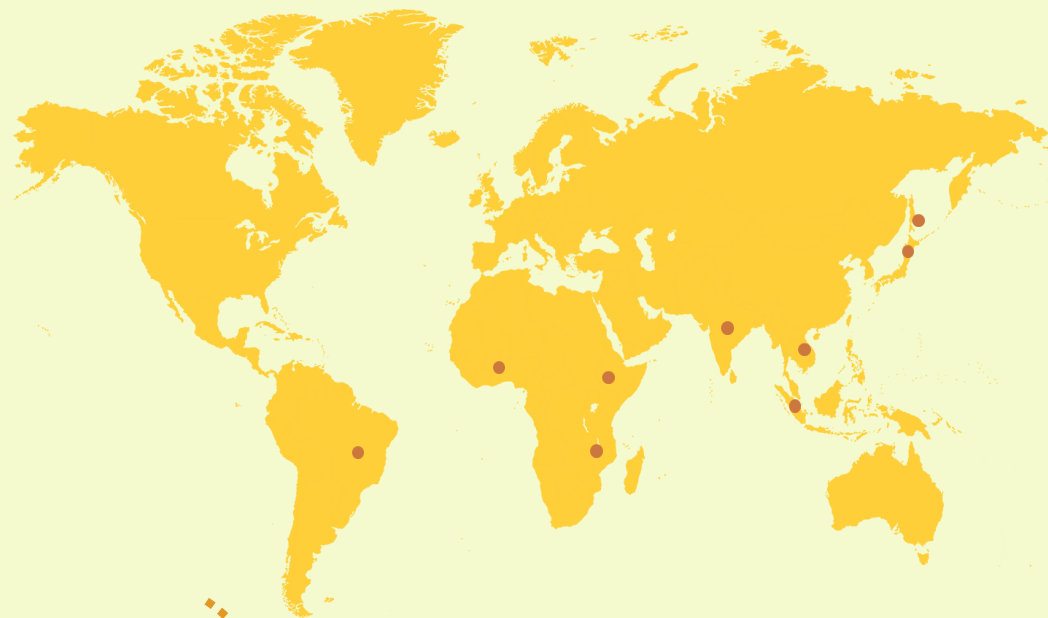

Read and Review

Poverty means that there is little or no money to meet basic needs such as food, water, clothing and shelter.

There are two types of poverty - absolute poverty and relative poverty.

Absolute poverty is a condition where **household income** is below a necessary level to meet basic needs of life including food, shelter, education, safe drinking water, etc.

Relative poverty depends on the level of development of the country. It is a condition where the household income is a certain **percentage** below **median** income.

household income

money received in a family, especially on a regular basis

percentage

a rate, number, or amount in each hundred.

median

situated in or extending toward the middle

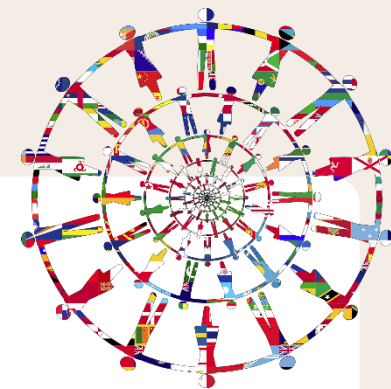

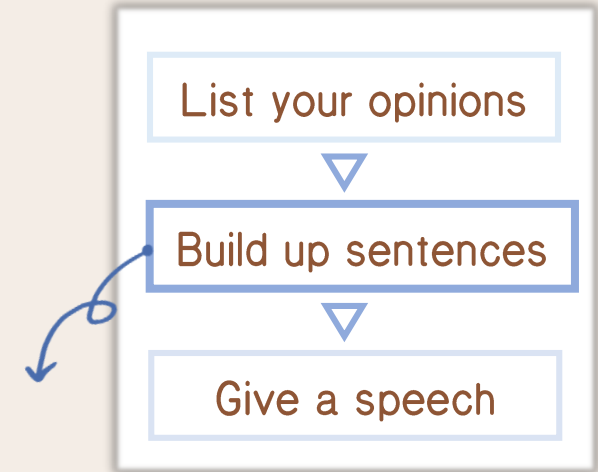
