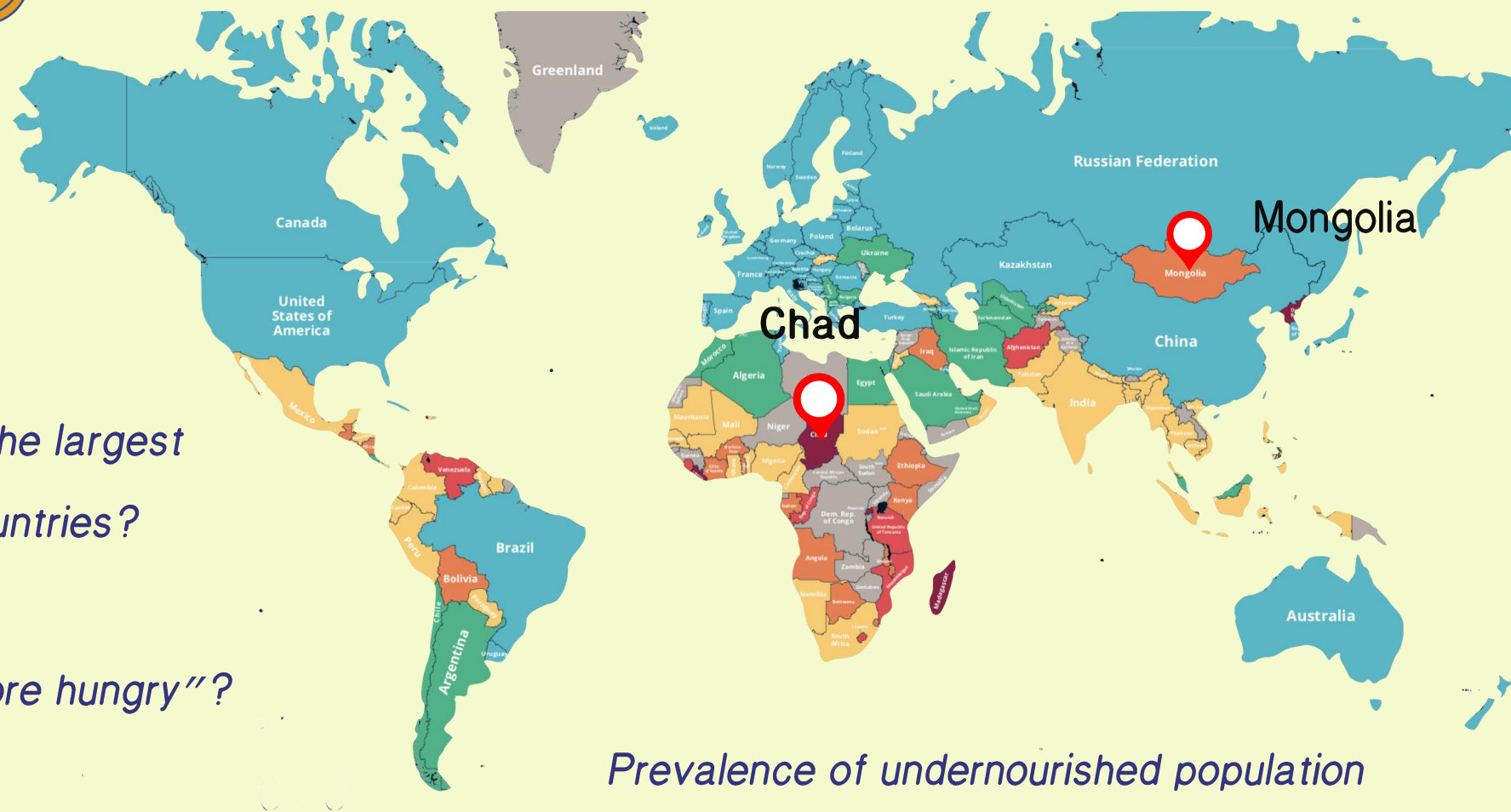




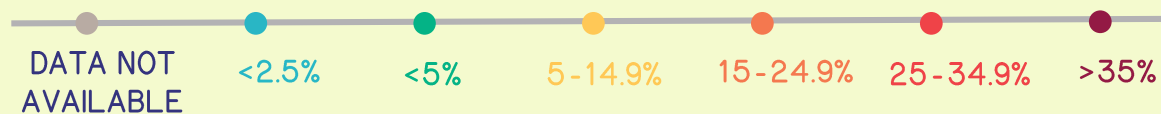

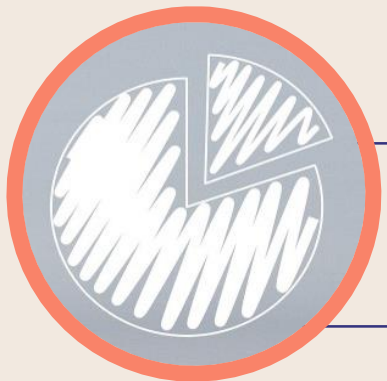

## Zero Hunger

We all need healthy food to help our bodies and brains grow strong so we can do great things. However, the number of people suffer from hunger is increasing all over the world.

Let's take India as an example. More than 200 million people in India stay hungry and one third of the children is **undernourished**. According to the FAO report, 51.4% of women aged 15 to 49 are **anaemic**.



*Undernourishment could lead to health problems, such as slow recovery from illness and difficulty on focusing.*



The report also said that 34.7% of the children aged under 5 in India are too short for their age which is called **stunting**. While 20% suffer from **wasting**, which means their weight is too low for their height.

The world produces enough food to feed all 7.5 billion people, yet 1 in 9 people around the world go hungry each day. Then what causes hunger in the world?

Here are two **primary** causes of world hunger.

## **stunting**

being 'too short for one's age

e.g. Jane is 18 years old but she is only 1.2 meters in height.

## **wasting**

being extremely thin for one's height

e.g. Mike is 1.8 meters but he only weighs for 45 kg.





## Poverty

Families living in poverty usually cannot afford nutritious food. Without proper nutrition, the body can't work well which makes it difficult for people to earn more money because of malnutrition.



## War

War is also one of the leading causes of hunger. In South Sudan, civil war has destroyed thousands of families. Many people were forced to abandon fields, which results in severe food shortages.
