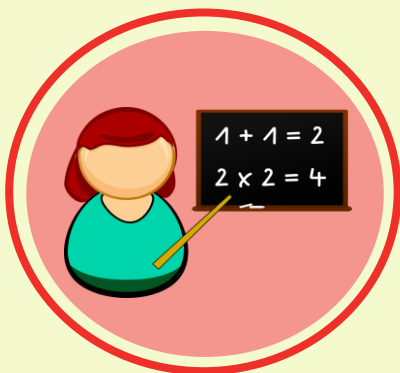

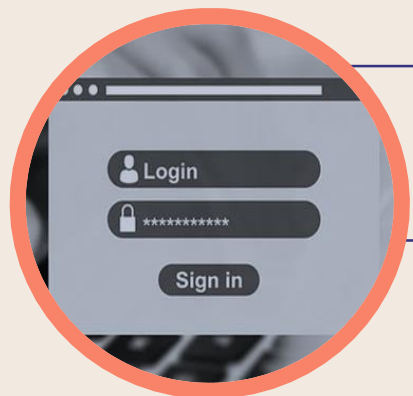




Words to Know

Reading

Quality Education

Education is the **key to** a better life and a better future. In the past 10 years, major progress has been made in **access** to education. However, there are still many children who do not go to school.

According to the Global Education Monitoring Report, some 61 million children of primary school age do not have the chance to go to school. More than 32 million of these children live in sub-Saharan Africa, and almost eleven million in South Asia. 53% of the children who do not attend school are girls.





Reading

The report also said that, in 2015 there were 62 million young people who did not go on to a **secondary school** after they finished **primary school**.

More than 140 million did not have the possibility to take the school-leaving examination. Eventually, they were not **qualified** to enter higher education or to graduate from school. Some 750 million young people (over 15 years of age) are **illiterate**, and almost two thirds of them are women.

primary school

A primary school is a school for children between the ages of 5 and 11.

secondary school

A secondary school is a school for pupils who are 11 or 12 and 17 or 18 years of age.



Reading

Education is the most powerful tool we have for sustainable development and this goal ensures that all girls and boys finish free primary and secondary schooling by 2030.

It also aims to achieve universal access to a quality higher education.
