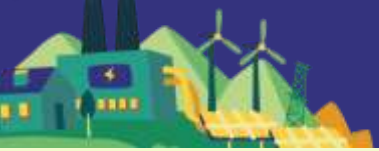

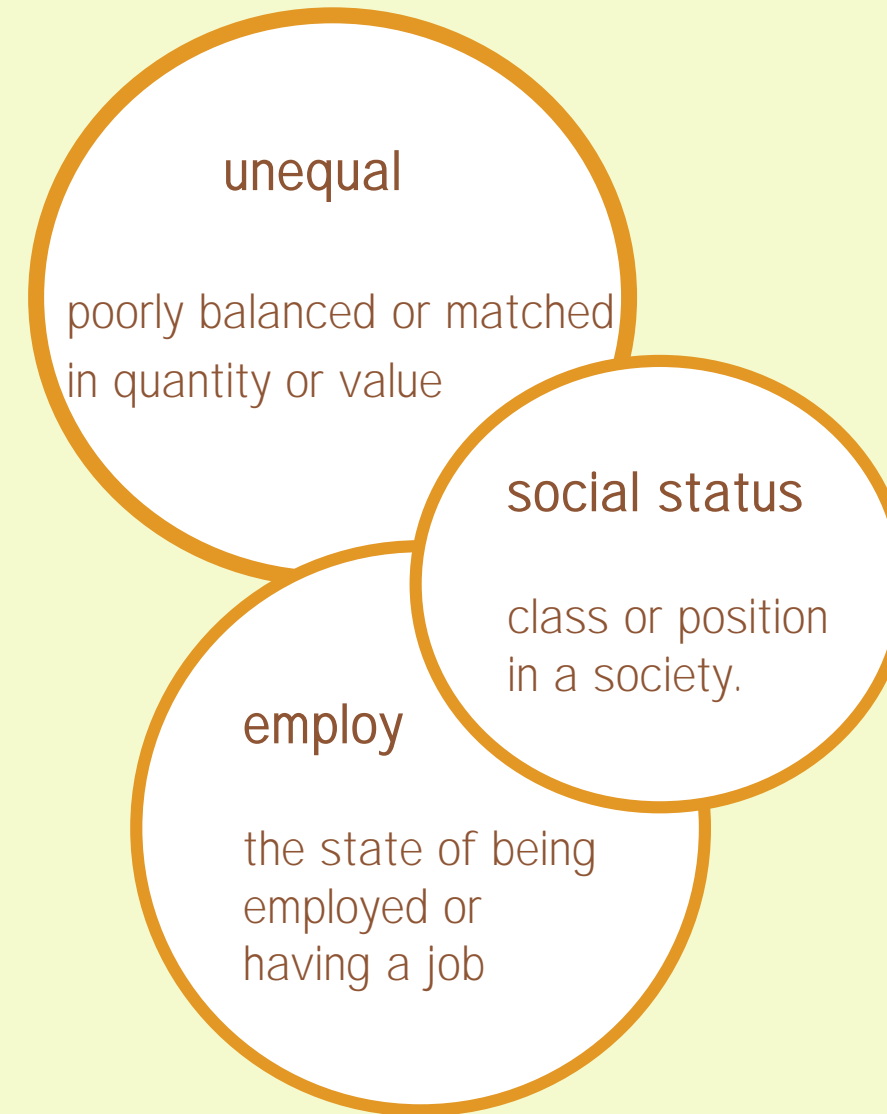


Read and Review

Gender inequality refers to **unequal** treatment or views of people based on gender – male or female. No matter in western or eastern culture, women and girls usually have lower **social status**.

In Congo, the husband is the head of the household which means the wife must obey her husband completely. In most Southeast Asian countries, often girls are not sent to school. They do not have enough ability to earn money because they do not receive a good education.

In some countries, there are still only few jobs provided for women even nowadays. Women are not **employed** in some job positions simply because of gender.

In Sweden

The rate of housewives in Sweden is only 2%. Sweden aims to protect professional women and encourage female employment.

In China

At present, the rate of women in the workplace in China is beyond the developed countries such as the United States and Germany. 61.48% of working women think they can balance family and work.

In India

Indian women spend 90% of their time on housework. Even if they are highly educated, they still choose to be housewives. India's female labor rate is only 28.5%.

In Japan

Japan mainly protects housewives and encourages women to stay at home, which has given birth to a huge class of housewives.

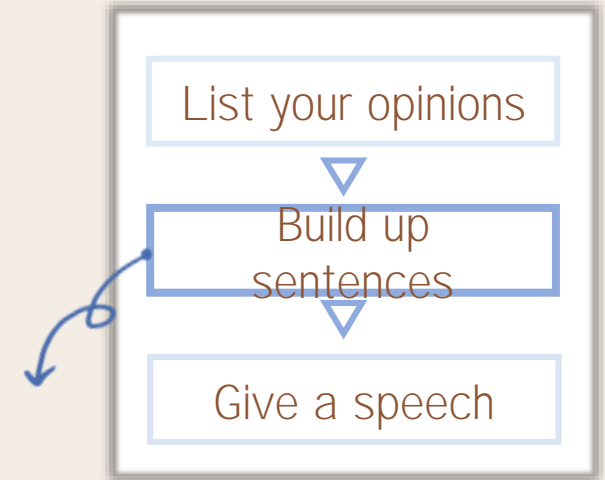
