### Violence Against Children

When people think of violence against children, their first thought may be of a child with bruises or other marks that show redness. But the signs aren't always so clear.

Violence against children happens when someone hurts a child's feelings or body in a way that affects their development and well-being.

Corporal punishment is the most common form of violence. It means causing pain or discomfort in response to a child's behavior such as spanking, slapping or pulling.



### Reading

Bullying is also another form of youth violence. It involves repeated physical or psychological harm and often takes place in schools and other settings where children gather.

One billion children globally experience some form of emotional or physical violence every year; and one child dies as a result of violence every five minutes.

Violence against children is a global issue and it calls for a positive response from the international community. The SDG 16 urges the world to place the protection of children at the heart of the policy with efforts of every nation.


