Modal verbs (can, could, might, may, will, would, must, shall, should) follow these rules below.

Think about how to correct the sentences.

- The verb that follows the modal verb <u>never changes</u>.

 e.g. I can helping him with his homework. X
- In a negative form, "not" follows a modal verb.e.g. He will doesn't come here anymore. X
- In a question form, the modal verb goes first.e.g. Do you must finish all the things today? X


