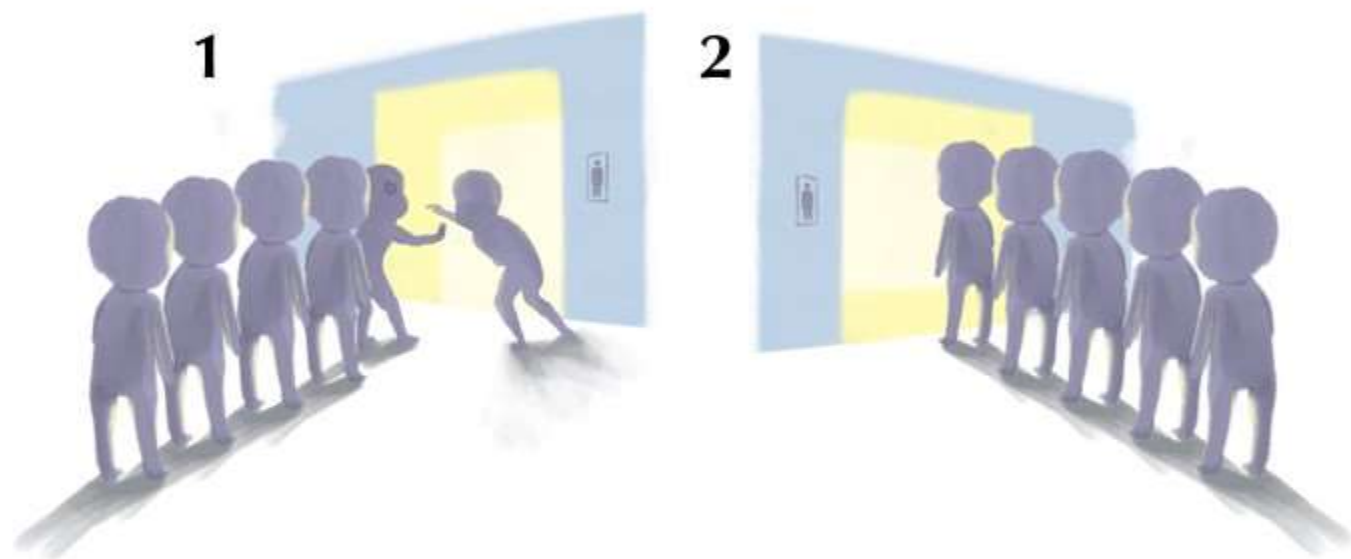

Good Manners

Good **manners** are important. They make you feel better about yourself. Good manners also help you in life. If you are kind to other people, they will do the same for you.

manners – polite ways of treating other people



Read and learn.

Here are some rules.

Say “please” and “thank you”.

- When you want something, always say “please”.
- Thank other people who give you food or drinks.
- When you visit a friend’s house, say “thank you” to their mum and dad.
- When someone opens a door for you, say “thank you.”
- Thank the **salesperson** who helped you.
- Thank the **cashier** at the **checkout**.
- Thank a waiter or waitress who brings your food.

salesperson – a person whose job is to sell things

checkout – a place in shop where you pay

cashier

—a person in charge of money at checkout

in trouble – in a difficult situation

offer – to do / give something to someone
