Greece: Cradle of Western Culture

Greece is a beautiful country in the south of Europe. The **capital** city of Greece is Athens.

There are **thousands of** islands in Greece! The biggest island is Crete. It is famous for its beautiful beaches. Millions of people visit Greece every year. There are more tourists than **Greeks** during summer.

The tallest mountain in Greece is Mount Olympus. Ancient Greeks believed it was the home of the Greek gods.

Greece is the **cradle** of the western culture. The Greek language is one of the oldest languages in the world. **Thousands of words** in English come from it. The ancient Greeks also invented **theatre** and **the Olympic Games**.



cradle

= the place where an idea or event begins



theatre

= a building where plays, movies, or concerts are presented.

the Olympic Games

= the greatest games from Greece which is done every after four years

One of the most famous Greeks was Homer. He was a **poet**. His long **poem**, The Odyssey, is one of the world's most famous books. Another famous Greek was Socrates. He is known as one of the best **philosophers** of all time. In Greece, children often live with their parents, even after they get married. Greeks live long lives. Their food keeps them healthy. They eat olive oil, lamb, fish and lots of fruits and vegetables.

= a person who thinks deeply about things



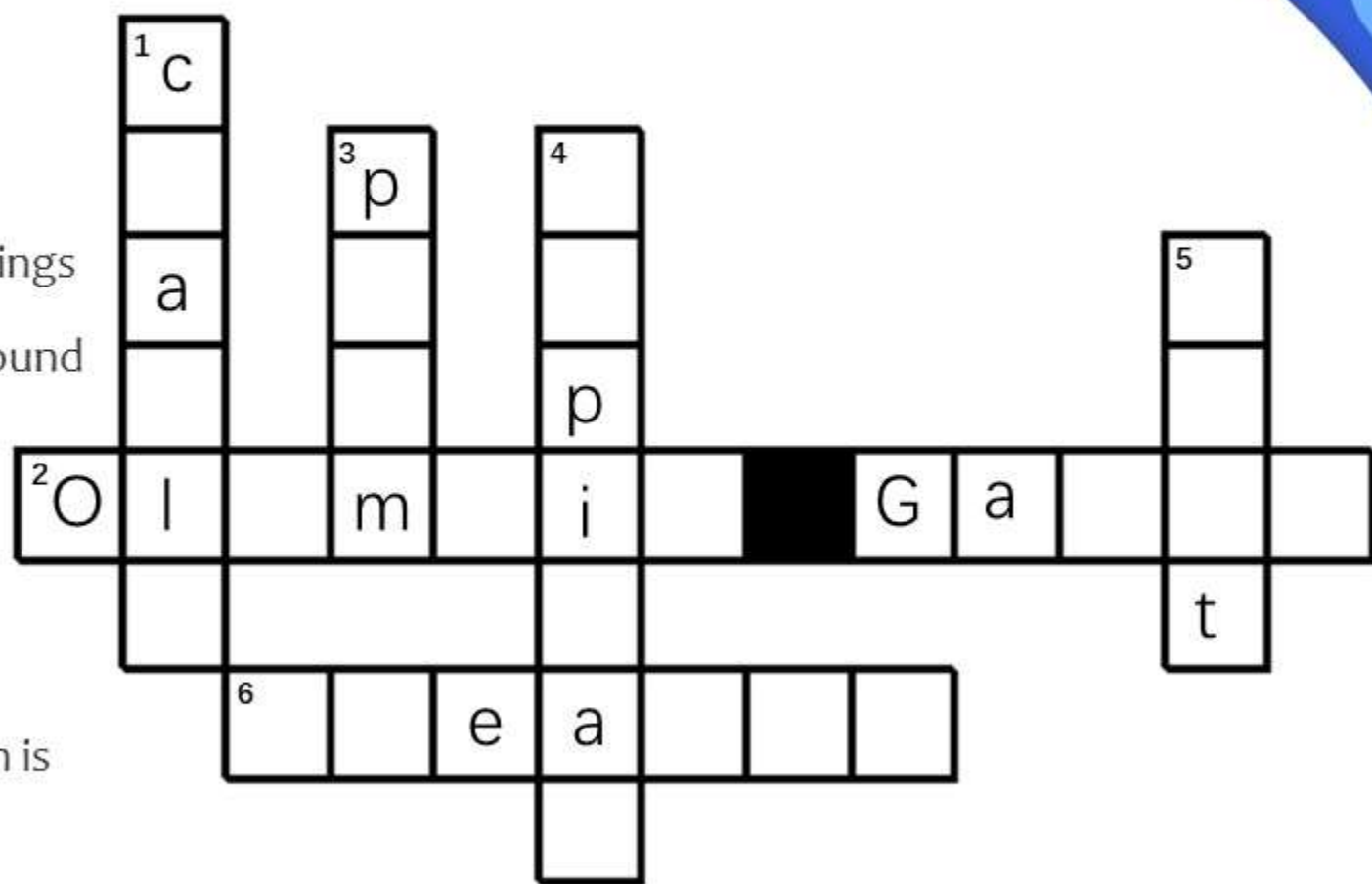

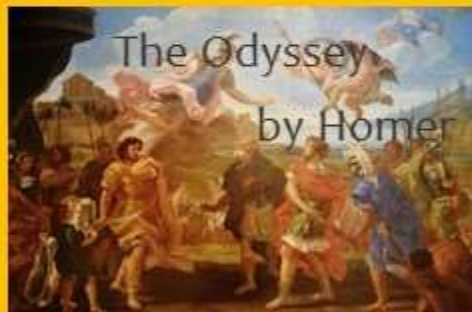
