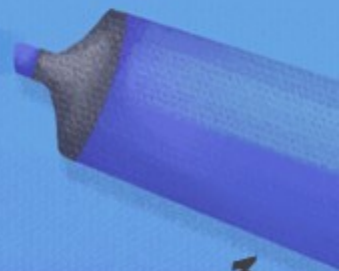

But she doesn't speak at all.

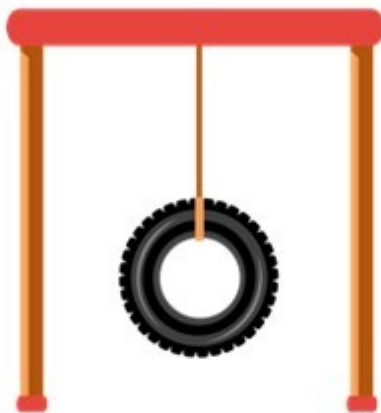
B. Don't Waste Food

We should not waste food. It is important to cherish food and refuse to waste it. We need to show respect to farmers and their hard work.

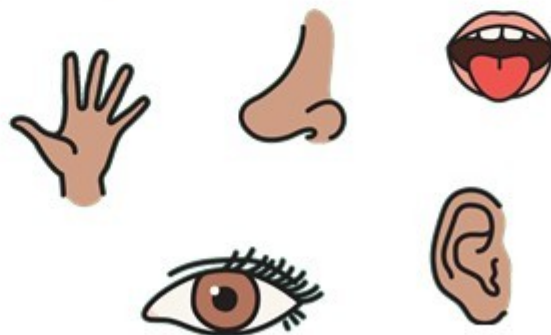
