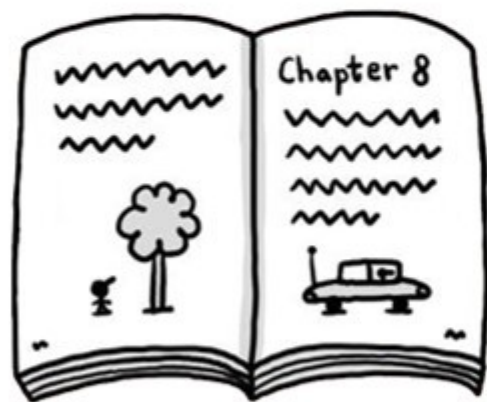


The **Ending** tells

**Beginning**

In the beginning, we write about **the title** and **the author**.

**Middle**

The middle tells **what the book is about** and gives **the main problem**.

**Ending**

The ending tells **why you like the book**.
